# **Purpose and impact**

- 1. Dorset Council's Outdoor Education Service maintains four outdoor and environmental education centres, one each at Weymouth, Wareham, Swanage, and Cranborne. There is strong support in the County for outdoor and environmental education through day and residential experience, and most Dorset schools make use of at least one of the County's Centres. The Service is based within Learning & School Improvement and the People Children directorate. This gives a very strong educational basis to all our work and very close links with the County's schools.
- With its interesting and beautiful scenery and World Heritage coastline, Dorset is very well placed for the delivery of excellent environmental and outdoor education.
  Purpose
- 3. To take a role in the teaching and supervision of groups at Leeson House Field Studies Centre.

### **Key responsibilities**

- 4. Work with and instruct children and young people from Primary to 'A' level in a very wide variety of subjects including geography, biology, environmental studies, orienteering, team games and problem-solving activities.
- 5. Act as one of the Centre's GCSE and A-level Geography (or other subject) specialists.
- 6. Take a role in planning courses and sessions.
- 7. Undertake the oversight and pastoral care of residential groups including some very occasional overnight duties.
- 8. Use the centre's minibuses to transport children, groups and equipment.
- 9. Other duties reasonably required by the Centre Manager commensurate with the level of the post.

NB: The duties and responsibilities of this post are not restrictive and the post holder may be required on occasion to undertake other duties. This will not substantially change the nature of the post.
