The provision offers highly individualised learning opportunities for pupils across EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2, including those with EHCPs or undergoing assessment. Supported by a skilled team and overseen by the Inclusion Lead, The DEN focuses on developing social communication, emotional and sensory regulation, and engagement in learning through structured routines, therapeutic input and carefully tailored activities while children await placement in specialist settings.
