

General Job description for a Primary Classroom Teacner

Main purpose

The teacher will:

- Fulfil the professional responsibilities of a teacher, as set out in the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document
- Meet the expectations set out in the Teachers' Standards

- Facilitate highly effective child-initiated learning experiences through the school's TED (Time to Explore and Discover), embracing the Hundred Languages of Children (Loris Malaguzzi) to develop children's languages of expression
- Provide high quality daily outdoor learning opportunities through the creative use of the Early Years Foundation outdoor area
- > Commit to ongoing research to further enhance the learning of children in the early years.
- Work effectively within a team scenario in an open plan base

- Build a culture based upon positive relationships, the value of listening and the fostering of children's rights
- > Develop an emergent, inquiry approach to the curriculum, utilising the mantle of the expert approach
- > Develop high quality learning within taught sessions through co-construction with learners.
- Explore innovative approaches to the development of English and maths skills and the broader curriculum, ensuring the highest possible outcomes for all children
- ➤ Utilise Reggio principles and embracing the Hundred Languages of Children (Loris Malaguzzi) to develop children's languages of expression
- > Provide high quality outdoor learning opportunities on a regular basis
- > Committed to ongoing research to further enhance the learning of children in KS1 / KS2

Duties and responsibilities

Teaching

- Plan and teach well-structured lessons to assigned classes, following the school's plans, curriculum and schemes of work
- Assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievements of assigned pupils, making accurate and productive use of assessment
- Adapt teaching to respond to the strengths and needs of pupils
- > Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- > Promote good progress and outcomes by pupils
- Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge
- Participate in arrangements for preparing pupils for external assessments

Whole-school organisation, strategy and development

- Contribute to the development, implementation and evaluation of the school's policies, practices and procedures, so as to support the school's vision and values
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school
- Work with others on curriculum and pupil development to secure co-ordinated outcomes
- Provide cover, in the unforeseen circumstance that another teacher is unable to teach

Health, safety and discipline

- Promote the safety and wellbeing of pupils
- Maintain good order and discipline among pupils, managing behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment

Professional development

- Take part in the school's appraisal procedures
- > Take part in further training and development in order to improve own teaching
- > Take part in the appraisal and professional development of others, where appropriate

Communication

Communicate effectively with pupils, parents and carers

Working with colleagues and other relevant professionals

- > Collaborate and work with colleagues and other relevant professionals within and beyond the school
- > Develop effective professional relationships with colleagues

Personal and professional conduct

- Uphold public trust in the profession and maintain high standards of ethics and behaviour, within and outside school
- > Have proper and professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school, and maintain high standards of attendance and punctuality
- Understand and act within the statutory frameworks setting out their professional duties and responsibilities

Management of staff and resources

- Direct and supervise support staff assigned to them, and where appropriate, other teachers
- Contribute to the recruitment and professional development of other teachers and support staff
- Deploy resources delegated to them

Safeguarding

- Work in line with statutory safeguarding guidance (e.g. Keeping Children Safe in Education, Prevent) and our safeguarding and child protection policies
- Work with the designated safeguarding lead (DSL) to promote the best interests of pupils, including sharing concerns where necessary
- Promote the safeguarding of all pupils in the school
